Aramaic Orders

These are orders to be used by the Achaemenid Persian forces. Aramaic was the *lingua franca* of the Achaemenid period - everyone across the region could speak it, including all of the forces under the control of the Achaemenids (Kuhrt 2017:11-12).

These orders will be used at shows, and the expectation is that members can understand what the order is asking them to do. This cheat sheet will be used in training sessions to make members familiar with them, and to get used to hearing them in stressful situations.
